Past Times in Kencot

Further memories from May Gosling (nee Simpson) assisted by others who were at a meeting in 2018.

Kencot Lodge

Kencot Lodge used to be three houses. Stella's (Chapman) grandmother lived in one of them at some point.

Mr Knowles lived in the first part. He had a second-hand shop in Alvescot. May Gosling recalled going up to the Kencot Lodge with her grandmother and there was second-hand items all over the front of his house.

Then the houses were turned into one after Mr and Mrs Knowles left. Mr and Mrs Ince lived in North Lodge. He had spent a lot of time in Africa. May remembers going up the steps to the house and Mr Ince opening the door. She saw the hall walls of North Lodge covered with spears and masks. She said 'I will never forget that sight as long as I live' Mrs Ince was a doctor.

Anne Oakey recalled how her little brother once kicked Mrs Ince at the village fete, then refused to apologise!

The Playground and Cricket Pitches

The playground was built in 1937. Before that it was just a field.

The village had two cricket grounds at that stage. One was behind the Eustaces and was fenced off so the animals couldn't get on it. May says it was a sacrosanct place. The other was Lans Field near the playground.

Leonard (Simpson) told the meeting that on the playground there were no football posts, but there were rugby posts pinched by Leonard and his mates from the nearby airfield when it was closed.

Belham Hayes

Belham Hayes was divided into three or four cottages. The first one was a tiny one-up, one-down cottage where 'Aunty Jess' lived, the others were uninhabitable and the children played in them.

Sunday 17 September 2023 : William Morris & Kelmscott

William Morris and Kelmscott Manor - a concert exploring the role of music in the life of Morris.

A young man steeped in classical, medieval and renaissance divinity, literature, music, art and architecture, William Morris embarks on life, but to what ends? He meets Jane Burden and they marry in 1859 and Morris's ideals become encapsulated in the founding of Morris, Marshall, Faulkner and Co (1861). They move to Kelmscott Manor in 1871, a hugely inspirational 'Heaven on Earth' with fishing, a wonderful garden - and artist Dante Gabriel Rossetti as an emotionally complicating co-tenant. Morris learns Icelandic and translates a huge swathe of Sagas, complete with dragons. A staunch socialist he writes Chants for Socialists (1885) and inspires composers Holst and Vaughan Williams. He also fights for historic buildings via ANTI SCRAPE (Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings, 1877) and promotes design through the Kelmscott Press, crafting handmade books with exquisite decorations. A final trip to Norway, and the fading William Morris returns to the Renaissance music which he loved at Oxford, listening as he lay in bed to Arnold Dolmetsch playing Byrd on his virginals.
