ROAD CLOSURE B4477 FILKINS TO ALVESCOT

Several people have commented that it didn't look as though much work was taking place on the road. I therefore contacted Andrew Madigan (Principal Engineer - Structural Maintenance) to ask how the work was progressing and this is his reply received on 26th February

Works are progressing well and I am pleased to report that we are on programme despite the wet weather that we had last week.

Works to date have included vegetation clearance throughout, although we still need to cut down an additional tree following approval from the OCC arboriculturist, clearing verges to establish the true road width, trial holes to confirm depth of shallow utilities, ditch clearance, replacing kerbs and drainage repairs.

The drainage repairs involve lining the existing damaged system that exists along the B4477 and as this drainage is all underground it may give the impression that no work has be done. Large vehicles and equipment are required to carry out this work which makes it unsafe to open the road.

The work this week involves further kerb and drainage repairs ahead of the surfacing works which will commence next Monday 4th March

Access was possible over the weekend and we were able to see the work that had been carried out. *Gill*

KENCOT HISTORY

Pinnocks: (Now Holy Blue House)

Mr. Perry grew fruit and veg in his greenhouses at Pinnocks. People from Langford, Filkins, Broadwell and Kencot used to queue up for a bag of his tomatoes. The villagers used to be rationed to one bag of tomatoes per family. Stella recalls her mother sending members of the family up at separate times to get a bag – thus having more bags of tomatoes than the allocation.

Coronation: 1937

Everyone recalled the great parties and celebrations held in the Eustace's barn.

There was one to celebrate George V1 coronation, the Jubilee, and the Queen's coronation. May recalls sitting on straw bales, the barn all cleaned out and decorated for the occasions.

May recalls: One day me and my friends wore May garlanding - that's what we used to call them - and Mr Barney asked us to sing our songs to him and he wrote them down - every word! May 1 st was Mayday so Gran Simpson used to decorate the wooden copper washing stick with flowers we would go singing our songs at peoples doors, for pennies, not for ourselves but for collections for whatever in village. One year I remember we gave it to Miss de Rougemont toward new piano for institute,(Village Hall).
