Past Times in Kencot

The Dossett Family - John Dossett-Davis lived with his wife Anne at the Dossett Old School House from about 1991 until his death in 2008. Anne continued to live there until 2016. Dossett Old School House was the village school from 1723 to about 1901 when it became a Reading Room for the village for 10 years. There was one teacher who lived in the cottage next door

John's family had a long association with Kencot. His great grandfather was the village Baker and his grandfather and other members of the family were born there and went to school in the village school.

The Bakers was the front part of what is now Well House (which later became the butchers) The family lived behind the shop but it wasn't joined on as it is now, but was a separate building. On Sundays the villagers used to take their Sunday lunches to his great

grandfather's to be heated up in the large hot oven. Pies were also baked for William Morris at Kelmscott.

Red Rose Close:

Contained 3 to 4 alms houses, Mrs Wilks lived in the top house, just one downstairs and one upstairs room. The other houses were the same. They all shared one well for all their water.

Mr Barney married twice. His first wife died. It was not known what he did. He lived at 1 Red Rose Close where later the Augers family lived. It was not known what he did but it was thought he might have been a writer. He got us singing at the door for ages writing down the words. His second wife and he used to ride a tandem. A young lad lived in the house with them. He was disabled. He used to appear sometimes when the children were playing in the playground then disappear again.

Mr Clack rode a bike and was knocked off it one day and was killed. he lived in the third house in the row ,and worked on the Bradwell Grove estate

Nurse Gasson lived at 2 Red Rose Close when she first came to Kencot in 1926 as the District Nurse. Her mother, Esther Groombridge came to live with her to look after the children, Molly (Foster) and Bill (Gasson) Her husband, Edward a Master Baker died in 1918 in Woodstock. One day when she came home from her journeys the wall had been built and she couldn't put her bike in the shed so from then on wheeled the bike through house, the coalman also had to carry the coal through the house.

Nurse Gasson's duties as District nurse involved cycling miles round the villages on her bicycle with her black bag 'in all winds and weather' visiting people and delivering babies. Mrs Acklin also delivered babies but was not a nurse, May's Grandmother also assisted.
